In the 8th year of his reign, curiosity or devotion induced him to undertake a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, where the fatigues of the journey and the heat of the climate so impaired his constitution he died on his way home. Some call him Robert the Magnificent.

England

defeated and killed his rival Harold at the battle of Hastings and became  
King. The Norman conquest of England was complete by 1072 aided by the  
establishment of feudalism under which his followers were granted  
land in

return for pledges of service and loyalty. As King William was noted for  
his

efficient if harsh rule.His Administration relied upon Norman and other  
foreign personell especially Lanfrnc Archbishop of Canterbury.In 1085 he  
started the Domesday Book.

Notes: The name Plantagenet came from when Fulk the Great being stung  
from

remorse for some wicked action in order to atone,went a pilgrimage to  
Jerusalem and was scourged before the Holy Sepulchre with broom twigs.  
Earlier authorities say it was because Geoffrey bore a branch of yellow  
broom (Planta-genistae) in his helmet.

He was Duke of Normandy 1144-1150.

Notes: Signed the Magna Carta 1215 at Runnymede.  
King of Ireland 1177, Earl of Gloucester.

13. Henry III King of England

Acceded: Oct 28, 1216 Gloucester Cathedral  
d. Nov 16, 1272 Westminster Palace London  
Interred: Westminster Abbey  
m. Berengere, Eleanor of Provence b. abt 1217

14. Edward I the Longshanks, King of England

b. Jun 17, 1239 Westminster Palace  
Acceded: Aug 19, 1274 Westminster Abbey  
d. Jul 7, 1307, Burgh-on-Sands, near Carlisle  
Interred: Westminster Abbey  
m. Marguerite of France b. 1279  
Notes: He is noted for encouraging Parliamentary institutions at the expense of feudalism. He tried to assert his authority over Scotland and died while on his way to fight Robert the Bruce.

His father had died when Thomas and his brother were young. They were raised in the Palace by Richard.
